Recognize the Early Signs

- My child doesn't consistently look up when I call his/her name.
- My child doesn't wave Hi and Bye.
- My child doesn't point to show body parts and pictures in books.
- My child doesn't smile at me when I talk.
- My child is more interested in objects than in people.

If your child is 12 - 24 months of age and you answered yes to some of the above statements your child may have a social communication delay or in some cases, may be at risk for Autism.

1. Discuss your concerns with your child's doctor

AND

2. Call **Talk 2 Me 519-252-0636** to request a Speech / Language Assessment.



OR

Call **Children First 519-250-1850** if you have a concern about Autism and your child's communication.



ACT EARLY

The earlier you recognize the signs of a social communication delay / Autism, the sooner you can learn strategies to help your child develop.
